Dear Parent/Carer,

Year 10 Mock Examinations 17 May 2021 – 28 May 2021

I am writing to inform you of the first set of Mock Examinations for Year 10.

These examinations are an essential part of preparation for the GCSE examinations. They give subject teachers an opportunity to assess your child's current knowledge and understanding of each subject, as well as how they perform under exam conditions. The results of these assessments will help us to arrange for targeted support and intervention to address areas in need of development, as well as provide initial information on foundation and higher tier entries for the final exams in Maths, Languages and Science. It is therefore essential that your child is as well prepared as possible for these exams, so that we have an accurate picture of where they are at in their learning.

Normal lessons will take place whenever your child is not in an exam.

Students will arrive to school at the normal time in the morning and go to their form room for a pre-exam briefing.

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For the mid-morning (periods 3 and 4) examinations, students will drop their bags off first in a designated bag room and then line up outside the sports hall 10 minutes before the examination commences.

As always, students must arrive in full school uniform and bring the following necessary equipment for each exam in a clear pencil case:

- black pen
- pencil
- ruler
- eraser
- calculator

Water must be stored in clear bottles without labels.

Students will not be allowed to sit their exam if they are late. Late entry to an examination room is at the discretion of the invigilator. Break time and lunchtime arrangements will be as normal. If your child is ill during the examination period please notify the school in the usual manner.
