In modern times, affluent most often describes wealthy people, or places where wealthy people live.

The idea of flowing is echoed in other words with the root *fluere* (flu) such as fluctuate, fluid, influence, mellifluous and superfluous.


Stanborough Summer School 2021

LTS Group Mascot Competition


Mrs Stratton, Assistant SENDCo, writes:

Kathryn has won a £50 voucher to spend, she will receive a framed professionally drawn picture of her mascot; her mascot will also be animated and used on the LTS Group website. The Nest provision has won a voucher too. Presentation of the prizes will hopefully happen before the end of term.

The competition was judged by a team of people including the Mayor of Enfield and two performers from 'Cirque du Soleil'. Kathryn was very happy and surprised she won. This is an amazing achievement, well done to all our Nest students for taking part.



District Athletics 2021 - 25th June 2021

Ridlins Athletics Track

On Friday 25th June we were all very happy to once again have the District Athletics competition taking place, another sign of things slowly getting back to normal. We took eight teams to Ridlins Athletics Track in Stevenage.

Our teams were very much a mix of experienced athletes and students taking part in an athletics match for the first time, so it was very difficult to predict how we would get on. Stanborough have historically been very strong in this competition over the years, always finishing in the top three schools in the district. There are 11 schools in the Mid Herts District and we were quite anxious about cementing our position in the top three.

After a covid test for all first thing, we arrived in the rain and got ourselves prepared for the day. Success quickly followed with both Sonny Walsh (Yr9) and Ben Sutton (Yr8) winning their hurdles events. Sonny also won his 100m and the Year 9 Boys won the Boys Relay as well, meaning Sonny finished the day with three gold medals, an amazing achievement. Our other district champions were Harry Western who won a very closely fought Yr10 1500m, and Louise Grenfell our Heptathlete, who won the Yr10 Shot with a new district record of 9.09 m. Louise was only able to compete in the shot as she was preparing for the county multi events on the Saturday where she finished an amazing 4th despite being a year young in that competition. She also ran a time of 2.13 for her 800m which would have qualified her for the national championships in the standalone 800m. Quite an amazing performance!

There were many seconds and thirds and other strong performances from all our athletes who coped extremely well with the hugely varied weather conditions and the waiting around that is inevitable in such a large competition.

So, it was with bated breath that the team sat and waited for the results to be read out.

3rd in Year 8 Boys

3rd in Year 9 Boys

3rd in Year 10 Boys

3rd Boys Overall

And 3rd in the combined boys and girls competitions. This was a truly amazing performance from all concerned and gives Stanborough a great starting point with which to come back next year and aim for the top two spots.

A huge thank you to all the staff who came and well done to all our amazing students.



There are 8 more girls in Year 8 than in Year 7


There are 32 fewer boys in Year 8 than in Year 7
