Summer School



If you want to have a go at a mono print at home, then don't worry about investing inexpensive materials – you can make it with a wax crayon or a soft pencil (3b or lower)



Rub 1 side of paper with your crayon or pencil. You need to apply an even layer – no textured scribbles!

Turn it crayon side down onto a clean sheet of paper

Draw your image or trace over the top of a photo then turn over to reveal your masterpiece!




For all the warm smiles to welcome us back to school! Teachers find it difficult to come back to high school as much as students and when we support each other it helps so much!

TASTY TREAT TIME!



INGREDIENTS



Apple turnovers!

- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 4 cups water
- 4 Granny Smith apples - peeled, cored and sliced
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 tablespoon water
- 1 (17.25 ounce) package frozen puff pastry sheets, thawed
- 1/2 cup icing sugar
- 1 tablespoon milk/ 1 egg

DIRECTIONS:

1. Combine the lemon and 4 cups water in a large bowl. Place the sliced apples in the water to keep them from browning.
2. Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Drain water from apples and place them into the hot skillet. Cook and stir for about 2 minutes. Add brown sugar, and cinnamon, and cook, stirring, for 2 more minutes or until sauce has thickened. Remove from heat to cool slightly.
3. Preheat the oven to 200 degrees C
4. Unfold puff pastry sheets and repair any cracks by pressing them back together. Trim each sheet into a square. Then cut each larger square into 4 smaller squares. Spoon apples onto the centre of each square. Fold over from corner to corner into a triangle shape and press edges together to seal. Place turnovers on a baking sheet, leaving about 1 inch between them.
5. Bake for 25 minutes in the preheated oven, until turnovers are puffed and lightly browned. Cool completely before dusting with icing sugar.

This recipe also works with rhubarb, blackberries, or pears!
