


## And the awards go to..



## HAPPY BIRTHDAY ROTHKO!




Mark Rothko was a painter who used colour to convey emotions. His work was usually quite large in scale and so enveloped the viewers senses. He would only title his work with numbers which left the audience to attach their own meaning to them. Born on the 25<sup>th</sup> of September 1903 – if he was still alive today, he would be 118 years old! That's a lot of candles on your cake!


## ANSWERS!
