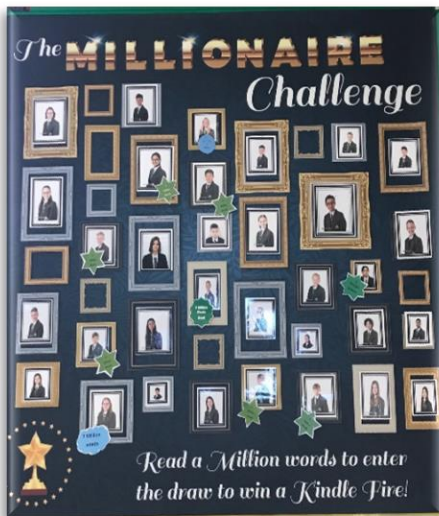

Total Books Read

Students at Stanborough School read 4,019 books during this school year.

What does it mean to read 4,019 books?

- Your students had 4,019 opportunities to fall in love with reading.
- Your students went on 4,019 adventures thanks to the stories they read.
- A great book is like a good friend a student can always count on to be there for them. Your students made 4,019 literary friends.

Total Words Read

Students read 175,130,272 words.

Experts estimate that students learn one new word of vocabulary for every thousand words read. Using this ratio, your students learned an estimated 175,130 new words.

By increasing the depth and breadth of students' vocabulary knowledge, those 175,130 new words could potentially have a huge impact on your students' success.



Student Participation

372 students completed one or more Accelerated Reader quizzes.

Why is student participation important? Student participation is critical, as AR can only track reading practice data—such as books read, words read, and engaged reading time—for participating students.

When students participate in Accelerated Reader, teachers can easily track their reading activities and help ensure students are getting the practice needed to strengthen their reading skills and build critical background knowledge.
