Message from the Headteacher - Mrs John

It is with such great sadness that we learn about the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. Rest in Peace, Your Majesty.

I am incredibly proud of the growth and success of the school since I started in Sept. 2018. The school has changed significantly in all aspects since September 2018 and it is great to see the impact of the changes in the examination results too. We must never forget that the growth and success of the school is as a result of the hard work and support of every member of teaching and support staff as well as the strong governing body and the support students receive at home. It is truly amazing to see that everyone accepts that they play an instrumental role in supporting our students to achieve their very best. We cannot under estimate the role that each of us play in this process and hence must be proud of the impact we have had and continue to have.

The most pleasing aspect of the Post 16 and GCSE results this year is that they have continued a strong trend of results that has built upon the sterling work by both students and staff over the last two years. The fact that our results have held solid from 2021, despite the rumoured harsher grade boundaries, is a huge credit to both our students and teaching staff. Most importantly, these grades have enabled our students, in the vast majority of cases (96% of 6th form students), to progress to their chosen pathway at post 18. Two students secured entry into the University of Cambridge.

A Level Results

Mrs John Headteacher, writes:

"Our children who are at the heart of everything we do are more than just grades. Grades do not define them but their character does. I am so proud of each and every one of our Year 13 students. The last time our students were in full time education was in Year 10. They had been significantly impacted by Covid, were not able to end Year 11 like previous students, were not able to have a Year 11 prom and did not get the chance to sit their GCSE examinations. In spite of all this, the resilience, strength of character, fighting spirit and the dedication they have demonstrated has been remarkable. They are all exceptional, inspiring and talented young people and we couldn't be prouder of them. They have been a credit to the

Stanborough community and have been wonderful role models to the rest of the school.

Stanborough students have received a set of remarkable A level and vocational results with the school recording its highest ever percentage of A^* and A grades. Several students achieved A- A^* grades, earning them places at a wide range of prestigious universities on highly competitive courses. 40% of A level grades were in the range of A^* -A and 71% in the range of A^* -B.

Cambridge, Durham, Nottingham, Reading Universities will welcome Stanborough students from September as well as others who will take places at universities to study a range of courses and degrees including Mathematics, English, Astro Physics, Economics, Biomedical Science, Music Business, Media, Psychology, Teaching, Marketing and Management, History and Politics, Geography, Business Finance, Finance, Investment and Risk, Sports, Law, Law and Spanish and Criminology."

A special message from Mrs John went out to staff for their 'tireless work behind the scenes' over the last seven years and acknowledged that teaching is an incredibly rewarding and humbling career where 'we have an impact on young lives' and shape their future.

Mr Maidment the Head of Sixth form was also thanked for his unstinting support of the year group and for always giving up his time to support them throughout their Sixth form education. Mr Maidment has been an inspirational Head of Sixth form for the last 15 years. He will now be stepping down and taking on another exciting leadership post at Stanborough. We will review the new homework policy at the end of this term.





Arbor

Mr Green, Assistant Headteacher, writes:

We are now using Arbor to manage our student information. Please see below some useful information about accessing this.



We're using Arbor's free Parent Portal and Arbor App

We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Arbor App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- 4. Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday

Need help using Arbor?

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

Some tips to try:

- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor.
 Ask us to check the email address linked to your account.
- 2. Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired. Ask us to send it again.
- Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice - e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- 5. Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- Only relatives who are **Primary Guardians** of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.
