

#### JANUARY HOUSE COMPETITION – MOBILE PHONE RECYCLING

Dr Searle and Dr Jolly, Science Faculty, write:

Have you got an old mobile phone languishing in a drawer? Are you hoping for a new phone for Christmas? Like me, did your provider tell you that your old mobile phone was too old to be reconditioned?!

If you answered YES to any of those questions, you will be pleased to hear that, during January, we will be collecting old mobile phones and other electronic devices for charity.

However old they are, these devices contain precious metals and other elements, some of which are in short supply. Many charities, such as Oxfam and Little Lives, collect old devices and sell them to specialist recycling companies to be broken down. This reduces the need to extract more of these precious substances from the ground, therefore reducing the destruction of habitats and landscapes and the huge demands of these activities on energy resources.

So it's a big WIN for the charities, you and the planet!

If you have the chance over the Christmas holidays, please hunt around for these old devices and ask around among friends and family. All we ask is that you make sure that you have removed the SIM card, any data or information saved on the phone and, if possible, reset to factory settings.
