

The primary schools that offered the work experience were Letchmore Primary School, Oakview Primary School, Creswick Primary School and Green Lanes, and they were fantastic in giving our students a real understanding of what it is like to be a childcare practitioner.



Maths Superstars

Students in Years 7-11 have been taking part in a wide range of team and individual competitions over the last few weeks and their achievements have been impressive.

The UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge took place on Thursday 2nd February and involved 58 of our Y9, Y10 and Y11 students. Aidan Wadley, Daniel Harrington, Zara Millar, Ben Paddick, Tameem Alom, and Austin Ashby all earned Gold Certificates and qualified for Kangaroo follow-on rounds. Kara Chauhan also earned a Gold Certificate. Silver Certificates went to Tahmid Halal, Maya Hirani, Ollie Thornton, Samuel Jeffrey, Martha Flint, Kathryn Stanley, Maggie Moylan, Matthew Dunstan, Lily Reding, Maxwell Chisholm, Jamie Merrill, Joshua Jeffrey and Lily-May Watkins. James Robinson, Moses Mbokolo, Rebecca Sanders, Navil Ahmed, Zara Printer, Maisy Buckingham, Olivia Preston, Joshua Carter, Olivia Scott, Hannah Broderick, Oscar Boyle and Poppy King all received Bronze Certificates.

Students in maths classes 8y1, 8y2, 8w1, 8w2, 8z1 and 8z2 all had the opportunity to take part in a pyramid relay quiz in the hall during one of their lessons in the week before half-term. They worked hard to solve questions as a team, with some able to build pyramids of 10 cards with a few spare but none quite able to reach the next pyramid of 15.

On Tuesday 28th Feb, it was the Year 10 Maths Feast in the morning and then the Year 7 County Team Maths Challenge after school. Navil Ahmed, Chennai Avery, Joshua Carter, Kara Chauhan, Lucy Eggleston, Martha Flint, Tahmid Halal, Jamie Merrill, Zara Printer, Olivia Scott, Kathryn Stanley and Ollie Thornton represented the school for the Year 10 competition. Kathryn, Chennai, Lucy and Ollie did particularly well in the true/false round (which was harder than it sounds!).

Team B, comprised of Kloe, Kolin, Kashvi and Damia, scored highly in both the first general maths round and the estimation round to take 6th place overall which may be enough to qualify for the final. We will know when all of the heats have finished. Well done to all of our mathematicians!

The pie chart shows information about how the students in Year 11 get to school.




