
Update on Coin Batteries!

The Stanborough Science department welcomed the Year 5 and 6 students from St John's Church of England Primary School on Tuesday 28th March.


The Stanborough Year 12 Biology students had great fun helping the St John's students to identifying salts from the flames they burned with and doing some neutralisation reactions.




Diagram **NOT** accurately drawn

Heads of School

Mrs Vlijter, Assistant Headteacher, writes:

Following our announcement of our new Heads of School last week, I can update you that the outgoing and incoming heads of school met this week for a handover. They were able to share top tips, and ask questions, to prepare for their start after Easter.

Thanks again to our outgoing team, who have served our school community so well. Here are some of their reflections, as they leave their posts to focus fully on their upcoming exams:

Bomo Alagoa: The role of headboy, has been for me, in summarisation, evolutionary. I have been able to develop as a person in a way that I'd never have envisioned for myself from delivering public speeches to organising and holding events it's all truly been a blessing complimented by lessons you learn as well as skills you pick up along the way. My proudest achievement would undoubtedly be my fulfilment of celebrating diversity here at Stanborough through my culture fest, which is a concept I envisioned long before my term served as head of school. Moreover, the other roles you take on as head of school also allow you to develop a sense of duty to you community and take pride in contributing towards the schools running. The most significant way in which this was truly cultivated for was through the open evening speech I delivered to hundreds of parents and fresh impressionable primary school students. I'm glad I was able to deliver a satisfactory message to the students as making an early and impactful impression was of the utmost importance for the school. Overall, it has been a delight to serve as head of school and I look forward to the skills I have learnt to be applied in my future endeavours past the parameters of sixth form.

Laura Wells: As I look back on my time as Head of school at Stanborough, I am overcome with such a wave of emotions. School is exceptionally challenging and it often feels as though we don't belong. That's why I made it my aim to try and make every single student feel welcomed, supported and listened to. I have great sadness that I am leaving this role but I have the upmost confidence that the next head of school team will continue to make these bonds with the younger students! You're in good hands.

Mollie Mardel: My focus as a member of the Heads of School Team has been on promoting our chosen charity this year, Cruse Bereavement Care. I've had the opportunity to speak to representatives and reflect on Cruse's values. I have taken great pride in informing students across the school, through delivering presentations, about the important work that Cruse do, and why as a community we're lucky to be able to support them. In December, I orchestrated the Yuletide Soiree accompanied by the Heads of School, a dedicated team of Prefects and a talented group of students. I'm proud of our achievement in raising around £600 for Cruse. Alongside fundraising, it's been rewarding for me to represent our school community in other ways. t's been an honour to work as Deputy Head of School during the school's heavily anticipated recent Ofsted inspection, and to speak with the inspectors with complete honesty and enthusiasm about Stanborough's inclusivity and successes. Within my first, and last, two years at Stanborough the opportunities I've been given have been immeasurable, and I'm very grateful. I have done my best to support all of our younger students in reaching their potential, and aiming to be the best, and happiest, versions of themselves possible through their academic journey. Being Deputy Head of School, has improved my leadership and communication skills, my adaptability and creativity, and most valuably, has given me a flavour of what challenges the working world after school may present me with and the confidence to stay resilient. For the student leadership team that will follow in our footsteps, I wish you the very best.

It has allowed me to grow in ways I did not expect, with useful lessons that I will bring forward with me into university and my career. After not knowing her at all beforehand, through this role we quickly became close friends which made the challenges of Heads of School much easier, and has been a highlight for me of this journey over the past year. I particularly enjoyed the social interactions with younger students in the school. The simple "hello, how you doing?" little chats, and even occasionally getting recognised out and about outside school, often made my day and gave me a smile as I walked on. This has prompted me to work with younger students in the future and has given me more confidence to teach and mentor later in my career. I am grateful for the decision to support the charity Cruse Bereavement Care as they helped me greatly in my own life. So the money we managed to raise through our Christmas Yuletide Soiree evening and other charity events is very much appreciated. Also the experiences in helping out at parents' evenings and presenting to form classes have been other highlights of the year, as these have provided me further confidence in public speaking, which I am sure I will find very helpful in the future. All in all, the Heads of School experience has helped me grow as a person, through a range of experiences that would not have been available otherwise, such as formal meetings with governors and Ofsted, public speaking, and the opportunity of reaching out to younger students. All of which I am incredibly grateful for. So thank you. 


