Coping with change and transitions

It can be a very unsettling time towards the end of the school year. Here are some tips to help with the changes happening in school and preparing to move into a new school year.

- **Allow for feelings and talk** Acknowledge your emotions and describe how you feel. Cry if you need to. Please talk to a trusted adult about how you feel, think about who is in your circle of support. If you struggle to talk, draw or write a letter.
- **Preparation** Where possible write down the changes and discuss these a few times before. Set yourself reminders about the changes coming up. Talk through your worries about the upcoming changes.
- **Try to keep routines the same.** Make sure other routines stay the same for example the time you go to bed. It's important to have some consistency.
- **Look after yourself**. Make sure during the time of change you look after yourself. This includes getting a good night's sleep, eating a balanced diet, making time for the things you enjoy and giving yourself a break






