CURRICULUM KS3

Students build upon the work they have done at KS2 on the six main world religions. They deepen their knowledge and understanding of British, local and world faiths and ethical systems, so that it provides a well-informed context for wider learning. Students identify key features and different faiths, make connections, draw contrasts, and analyse trends within and between belief systems.

They develop both religious and ethical terminology and concepts. Students pursue religiously valid enquiries including some they have framed themselves, and create relevant, structured and evidentially supported accounts in response.

CURRICULUM KS4

GCSE

At GCSE we offer the OCR (9-1) Full Course Specification for Religious Studies. This course encourages students to develop their knowledge and understanding of world religions, and philosophy and ethics. This course is structured into two component:

In Component 1 (Beliefs and teachings & Practices)
Students study the beliefs, teachings and practices of
two of the following major world religions:; we study
Christianity and Islam at the moment.

In Component 2 (Religion, philosophy and ethics in the modern world from a religious perspective) Students study different philosophical and ethical arguments and their impact and influence in the modern world from the perspective of Christianity

There are four themes of study: Relationships and families, The existence of God, Religion, peace and conflict and the Dialogue within and between religions and non-religious beliefs.

CORE - Cultures, Societies & Ethics (CSE)

All students study a carried course which is aim to help equip students for their future lives in Britain and further afield. This includes both religious, ethical and social studies which includes, family life, relationships a and sex-education, personal growth and stress management, holocaust studies and the role of peace and conflict in society ,and the role that faiths and cultures play in shaping and building society both here in Britain and elsewhere in the world.

CURRICULUM KS5

A-Level

At A-level we follow the AQA Philosophy specification. This qualifications gives students a thorough grounding in the key concepts and methods of philosophy. Students have the opportunity to engage with big questions in a purely secular context. Students develop important skills that they need for progression to higher education. They learn to be clear and precise in their thinking and writing. And they engage with complex texts, analysing and evaluating the arguments of others and constructing and defending their own arguments.

Subject content:

- 1. Epistemology
- 2. Moral philosophy
- 3. Metaphysics of God
- 4. Metaphysics of mind

Students are required to demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the content, including through the use of philosophical analysis (conceptual analysis and argument analysis). Students learn to analyse and evaluate the philosophical arguments within the subject content to form reasoned judgements. They develop an understand the philosophical claims which are made within each topic and must be able to articulate those claims correctly, clearly and precisely.

Post-16 Core

At Post-16 students consider themes, highlighted by the Hertfordshire Agreed Syllabus, as part of the Post-16 Tutor & Enrichment programme.
