




#### House Celebration Day, Friday 6th October

#### How long have you been doing athletics?

Seven years since my first junior parkrun at age 7.

#### How do you handle the pressure of competing at high level?

To begin with, running was always something I just loved doing for fun. As racing got more competitive, I started to not enjoy it as much which led to frustration because of the pressure I was putting on myself to succeed. So, I decided to have a more positive attitude and go on more runs with my family.

#### Are you wanting to do this as a career or just a hobby? Why?

As much as I would love to break the 800-metre world record or achieve Olympic Gold I am just enjoying running as a hobby and am realistic about the level of dedication and training it would take which I am not quite ready for yet.

#### What is your goal in the future?

My goal in the future is to continue breaking my own personal records and doing well in this year's cross-country season.

#### What motivated you to become a sports person?

For me my motivation has always been races and faster times. Sometimes during training, you don't feel your best or like you want to give up but at the end of the day you just need a long-term goal, like the feeling of elation after a race.

#### What advice would you give people interested in athletics?

People who are interested in athletics should definitely give it a go. You could join a nearby club or just go out for a jog at a parkrun or in the surrounding area.





#### Question 1

ABCD is a rectangle. EFGH is a trapezium.






All measurements are in centimetres.

The perimeters of these two shapes are the same.

Work out the area of the rectangle.

#### Question 2

A frustum is made by removing a small cone from a large cone as shown in the diagram.



Volume of cone = 
$$\frac{1}{3}\pi r^2 h$$

The frustum is made from glass. The glass has a density of 2.5 g/cm<sup>3</sup>

Work out the mass of the frustum.

Give your answer to an appropriate degree of accuracy.

(Mass = Density x Volume)
