



Thursday 23rd November 5.30pm £5 Adults, £3 Concessions



Attendance Matters..... 04.09.23 to 15.11.23

Under education law, parents do not have an automatic right to take their children out of school during term time. The school holiday dates are published a year in advance and parents are expected to arrange their family holidays during those times.

Requests for leave of absence for family holidays, in line with government guidelines, will normally not be authorised unless there are exceptional circumstances. Leave of absence should be requested at least one month in advance. The parent will be advised of the school's decision in writing. If the leave of absence request is denied and the student is absent during the requested period, the parent may be liable to receive a fixed penalty notice from the Local Authority. Penalty notices are issued on a 'per parent per student' basis.



Remembrance Day Service

Stanborough Biologists complete a two-week marathon with AMGEN


In 2019, scientists first became aware of the coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2), infecting people in every country with the respiratory condition known as COVID-19. Schools and workplaces shut down, hospitalizations increased dramatically, and governments struggled to respond to the crisis. Almost immediately, researchers began to look for treatments for those affected and the "gold standard" COVID test emerged quickly. The test uses polymerase chain reaction (PCR), which is a laboratory technique used to analyze genetic material. In this case, it was used to determine if the virus is present.

Our Biologists followed the Amgen Biotech Experience (ABE) programme with the use of the ABE practical kit and resources that enabled our students to engage in hands-on biotech experiments that would otherwise remain beyond reach for many schools.

The students had hands-on experience in Micropipetting, Gel Electrophoresis, Cloning a Gene, **use of the PCR machine** and Transforming bacteria with a recombinant plasmid.

We thank AMGEN, UK ABE, and University of Hertfordshire for enabling our students the use of this research-grade equipment which would have been impossible without their programme.

Well done to our Biologists and look out for our DNA Profiling techniques that could be used in criminal investigations!















Duke of Edinburgh at Stanborough

Mr R Collinson, DofE Award Coordinator write:

We are excited to be running the Duke of Edinburgh Award at Stanborough again this year. For those of you who are unsure what this entails this award has supported generations to successfully navigate adult life. 14-24 year-olds can do a DofE programme at one of three progressive levels which, when successfully completed, leads to a Bronze, Silver or Gold Duke of Edinburgh's Award.

There are four sections to complete at bronze and silver level and five at gold. They involve helping the community/environment, becoming fitter, developing new skills, planning, training for and completing an expedition and, for Gold only, working with a team on a residential activity.



A young person can do their DofE – regardless of ability, gender, background or location. Achieving an Award isn't a competition or about being first. It's all about setting personal challenges and pushing personal boundaries.

Through a DofE programme young people have fun, make friends, improve their self-esteem and build confidence. They gain essential skills and attributes for work and life such as resilience, problem-solving, team-working, communication and drive, enhancing CVs and university and job applications. Top employers recognise the work ready skills Award holders bring to their business.

At Stanborough we currently have about 50 students from Y10 currently starting their Bronze Award. We have young people working with animals, cooking, doing sports, helping out in charity shops, to name just a few. The range of different options they have chosen is amazing.

'The DOE has been very enlightening and enabled me to use my time in a positive and constructive way by volunteering at the local Hatfield Library. The award would hopefully enhance my social skills in the community and enable me to integrate within the society. I am looking forward to propelling my skills in Art and improving my physical health in my chosen sport. I am currently counting down for the expedition date as I can hardly wait!'

Anna Brasovanu in Y10 says:

'I started DofE because I wanted to expand my knowledge in activities I'm very interested and passionate in, but also make connections. I am in the middle of the Volunteering stage and for my Physical and Skill I have chosen to continue doing two of the things I absolutely love which are Boxing and my Drama academy (Emil Dale). Even if I haven't started doing the DofE course for them yet, I'm learning so much already. All you need to remember when doing anything is that you did good, but you can always improve, in yourself, because that is the person who can push you the most to do something.'

Tami Burgess in Y10 says:

'For my Duke of Edinburgh I have decided to do dog training under the Kennel club good citizen dog scheme. I am doing this with Doodledash Training.
