
# Attendance Matters..... 04.09.23 to 22.11.23

#### Joint effort pays off!

Mrs Shah, Senior Science Technician, writes:

We are grateful to Mr Bell and Mr Beevor in our Art, Design & Technology department who assisted the Science department in creating our own combs for DNA Manipulation. Electrophoresis combs are used to create the wells in gels and use the electrical charges of molecules to separate and analyse DNA fragments.

This apparatus was created using a laser cutter and a 3D Printer and having this piece of equipment enables our Year 8, 9, 10 and 11 year groups to acquire a hands-on experience within the school through-out the year. This idea arose after we completed the two week intensive labs with our Year 13 Biologists.

Solve the equations


$$x^2 + y^2 = 36$$

Following our sporting successes last academic year, this term so far has been no different. We have had a wide range of sports that have been in competition, ranging from netball, to football and cross country fixtures.
