



Introducing Year 7 Geography

Mrs Macdonald, Geography Teacher, writes:

A murder mystery!

Yr7 pupils started their geographical journey in September with a 'Map Skills Murder Mystery', using their newly acquired skills in direction, scale, distance and grid references to investigate a range of clues. We saw a fantastic level of enthusiasm and teamwork (as well some healthy competition) as pupils raced to identify the imaginary killer from a list of 32 suspects – thankfully, they discovered that their own teachers were not guilty! The rest of the term has been dedicated to helping pupils understand what geography is, exploring key themes including our global connections, migration, landscape and sustainability. Pupils have embraced opportunities to be creative in their learning, particularly when using play-doh to model landscapes. Most importantly, we hope this unit has inspired pupils to be curious about the world around them – please see the suggestions below for opportunities to further encourage this at home.

Good Geographers Ask Questions!

The best way to support pupils with geography outside the classroom is to encourage them to ask questions about the world around them (*even if you don't have the answers – pupils can ask us in lesson or research themselves*). Here are just a few suggestions:

- If you are going for a walk, question how the landscape was formed, notice changes to the environment at different times of the year or consider how the area is used by people and animals.
- Follow what is going on in the news and discuss, for example, how winter storms affect people in different parts of the UK or how the new volcanoes being born off the coast of Japan might look in the future.
- Look at the packaging on your next supermarket shop and think about why we get certain foods from particular
 places (extra challenge try to calculate the total distance your Christmas dinner has travelled before arriving
 on your plate!).

Coming Next.... After Christmas we will be studying the physical geography of the UK, including relief, rocks & scenery, water supply and rivers – lots to look forward to!
