




Attendance Matters..... 04.09.23 to 30.01.24

What does the law say?

- All parents of children aged 5 16 who are registered pupils at a school have a legal duty to make sure that their child attends regularly and on time. You must make sure your child is at school when they should be and that they arrive on time for both morning and afternoon sessions.
- If you don't do this and there are no legitimate reasons, such as illness for the non-attendance, a Local Authority Attendance Officer may become involved.

Please remember that you can contact your child's tutor and year leader if you would like support on how to improve your child's attendance and punctuality to school.

North Hertfordshire College is pleased to announce our open afternoon at Springboard Letchworth which will be held on Thursday 15th February from 2.30pm – 5.30pm at our prestigious premises. This is an opportunity for professionals, parents, and prospective students to meet the team and find out more about the Springboard programme.

Please note our address for this event will be:

Springboard Letchworth Town Hall, Broadway, Letchworth Garden City, Hertfordshire, SG6 3BX

If you are not already aware of Springboard it is a full-time personalised course which provides students with the support, knowledge, skills and confidence to become more independent, make informed decisions and ultimately to progress into mainstream college and work. The course is delivered in self-contained teaching centres in Watford and Letchworth.

Springboard is for young people aged 16-24 who require additional support before progressing to a cross college vocational course or employment. Many of our students have a diagnosis or traits of autism. Many have associated emotional and mental health needs that require specialist and bespoke support before they can move on and make a successful transition to adulthood.

Students need to meet our assessment criteria in order to access the provision although individual needs are always considered and decisions are made on a case by case basis and subject to funding being approved by the Local Authority.




Diagram **NOT** accurately drawn

Measles

Public Health Director, Hertfordshire County Council, writes:

Measles cases in the UK have been rising since November 2023. While Hertfordshire has no outbreaks at the moment, we are close to London and the West Midlands where there has been a large rise in cases. The UK Health Security Agency has declared the increase in cases of measles a national incident (19 January 2024). There is the potential for cases and outbreaks in Hertfordshire as uptake of the Measles Vaccination (MMR) in the county is lower than recommended.

Measles is spread through coughing and sneezing, close personal contact or direct contact with infected nasal or throat secretions.
