

Professional artists will be creating original works both inside and outside of the school buildings in a project being run in partnership with the university of Bath and Bath Spa University





Immersive Lego Artworks in London

Famous Artworks, including the Mona Lisa and Michelangelo's David, have been reconstructed in Lego, alongside a six metre Tyrannosaurus Rex.

The touring show The Art of the Brick has been described as "the most elaborate display of Lego art ever".

The name 'LEGO' is an abbreviation of the two Danish words 'leg' and 'godt', meaning 'play well'. The exhibition, which comprises more than 100 words, opens on Wednesday 6 March at The Boiler House on Brick lane.
