Girls into Computer Science Coding Challenges and STEM event

On Friday 22 March 2024, we took a group of 12 Year 9 girls to a Computer Science STEM event focussed on a series of web development and coding challenges. Computer Science is the fastest growing STEM subject yet males outweigh the females in most areas of this sector. The event was led by STEM ambassadors who were able to share their industry experience with the students before completing activities. Students had to use HTML to develop web pages and then used a series of coding activities to simulate a vault scenario which housed a precious diamond. Since half term, the Nature & Eco Club have made excellent use of our new 'Good to Grow' gardening equipment on Tuesdays after school and sown a number of seeds in mini-propagators with a view to planting them in the butterfly-friendly Kaleidoscope Garden.

The fastest to germinate and most successful were the Nasturtiums, which we have now potted on. On our return in April, we plan to place them in our mini-greenhouses for protection until the risk of frosts has passed.

We also have Yarrow, Rudbeckia and Achillea seedlings growing well. The students are looking forward to sowing other seeds both indoors and directly outside later in April.

We have another bug hotel in the making which will double as a raised bed for some of the flowers, including the nasturtiums, in a bid to save them from being eaten by the rabbits!

World Autism Awareness Week 2nd – 8th April 2024

Mrs Tillbrook, Autism Lead, writes:

This week Stanborough students learnt about what autism is during their tutor time activities. They learnt that autism is a lifelong developmental difference that affects the way that people perceive the world around them. Many have sensory sensitivities and find it hard to self-regulate when they are struggling with sensory overload. Some of our young people find it hard to form friendships and need a bit of extra help and many experience high levels of social anxiety. Life is easier for them if it is calm, and predictable. We have 56+ students with autism at Stanborough School. We should celebrate their differences. Whatever their needs are, they are supported by a wonderful team of staff.

Evidence shows over 60% of children and young adults with autism experienced bullying. Among them secondary students are most likely to be bullied because they are 'different'. We are ensuring that this is not the case for our autistic young people. At lunch time they have a choice of safe spaces to go, where friendships are encouraged and fostered. We have Mrs Tillbrook, a specialist Autism Lead and offer several supportive interventions.

Happy Autism Awareness week to all our autistic children and their families.

Year 10 Maths Feast Team Competition

Tuesday 19th March saw the annual Year 10 Maths Feast competition with seven teams of four students competing against each other and against teams from other schools around the country who had also joined online. The first round was based on popular TV quizzes such as Only Connect, Richard Osman's House of Games and the 1% Club. All Stanborough teams performed well in this round, but Teams 2 (Zara Millar, Yasemen Savasci, Izzy Jarvis and Hannah Broderick) and 3 (Paige Wadley, Rebecca Sanders, Waiswa Abdalla and Denzel Adebambi) did especially well. Round 2 was a Cross-number puzzle and students were allowed to use calculators. It was still challenging, and Team 5 (Honor Beverstock, Zac Lewis, James Robinson and Oreoluwa Oyedare) scored the highest with just a few marks short of a perfect score. Team 5 gained their perfect score in Round 3 - the Maths Hatters round, which was all about logic- and they were joined by Team 4 (Izzy Harrington, Siya Harani, Logan Wade and Moses Mbokolo) who also scored full marks. Finally, Round 4 involved both construction of cubes and rhombic dodecahedrons with folded paper and tape and then questions to answer about their models. All teams did reasonably well, but once again Team 4 excelled. Overall, Team 5 scored most highly among the Stanborough teams, with Team 4 and Team 2 taking joint second place and Team 3 in third place. Trisha Ahir, Frank Brocklesby Sum, Harvey Carr-Drake, Leo Gomes, Whiston Lee Nazara, Alec Lowe, Fraser Macdonald, Oliver Model-Shepherd, Shavini Paalayangoda, Jabir Rahman, Serkan Savasci and Taylor Villiers also gave their all to the varied







rounds, producing strong performances. The competition would not have been possible without the help of Year 12 students Tameem Alom, Stephen Grigg, Poppy King, Ben Paddick and Aidan Wadley, who handed out the materials for each round and marked the teams' answers.

As the spring term comes to an end we want to reminisce on some of the sporting successes and talented performances our students have accomplished over the last term.




