

Mr. Mason, Teacher of Mathematics (ex-Deputy Head)

Mr. Mason served the Stanborough community for a whopping 32 years! He joined Stanborough School as the Head of Mathematics Faculty in 1992. A few years later, in 1999, he was promoted to the position of Assistant Head and then he served as a Deputy Head from 2004 to 2019. Over his long service, Mr. Mason line managed various year groups and faculties. His other roles and responsibilities included managing staff cover, timetabling, data and assessment, performance appraisal and the smooth running of public exams for the school. For those of you who do not know, Mr. Mason played a key role in bidding for the Mathematics and Computing Specialism for our school. Throughout his career, Mr. Mason was a great inspiration to many teachers and students. His witty sense of humour kept both staff and students on their toes, and his dynamic and energetic teaching style guaranteed to enthuse one and all. For Mathematics teachers, Mr. Mason was the 'expert' in the team, especially in relation to solving complex problems in Further Mathematics.

Being trained to teach PE as well, Mr. Mason ran a club for basketball enthusiasts for many years. One of the memories which will be cherished by those who worked with him is his conducting of the 'gunging' ritual during the 'Run for Stanborough' events. Outside of school, Mr. Mason is an avid bee-keeper. Teachers in the Mathematics Faculty have now been educated on a variety of interesting facts about bees, from telling the difference between a bee and a wasp to the mystery of the bees' waggle dance.

Mr. Mason was an incredible colleague and a mentor. He will truly be missed by all. We wish him a lovely time with his bees, with his travels in his motor home and with being a professional grandad! Happy retirement!!!

County Team Maths Challenges

Mrs Coldwell, Extracurricular Leader: Mathematics, writes:

Stanborough's "Team B" from the Year 7 County Team Maths Challenge held back in February did well enough to qualify for the final of the competition last week. Lucas Gomes, Logan Humbles, Michael Lines and Riyaansh Mathew travelled to Robertson House in Stevenage to face 20 other finalist teams in a competition very similar to the original heat. The rounds were again general maths problems, memory, estimation and finally another general maths round. The

questions were suitably difficult for the final but the team performed even better in the third round than they had in the heat. In the end, their 16th place finish was very impressive in the context of the 106 teams that took part across the county!

This week, the process started for the Year 8 teams with the heat taking place on Monday afternoon. Maxim Tabany, Enna Wentford-Hall, Roman Scott and Kloe Francis came 8th in the heat with excellent scores in the first general maths round and the estimation round. Davina Adepoju, Charlotte Winston, Daisy Boville and Natalie Eckland came 10th with a very similar



score and an excellent memory round. Kolin Varhelyi, Kiran Chauhan and Ilan Sallay performed particularly well with just 3 team members scoring just as highly as the other teams in the first and final general maths rounds.

Meanwhile, Years 7 and 8 took part in the UKMT Junior Maths Challenge with the following notable successes: Riyaansh Mathew earned a Gold certificate as well as Best in School (an excellent achievement for a Year 7). William Morris also earned a Gold certificate. Kloe Francis earned a Siver certificate and Best in Year for Year 8. Silvers also went to Natalie Eckland, Edward Kane, Ilan Sallay, Erik Daci, Michael Lines, Damia Wan Faizul, Alban Wadley, Vanessa Fedorov, Lewis Hayward-Bradley and Lucas Gomes. 

PE Report 5th May 2024

To begin the athletics season we had our first county league fixture at Ridlins End athletics track in Stevenage last Wednesday 1st May. We faced our first opponents of the season: Hitchin Girls, St Columbus, Monks Walk and Dame Alice Owens. Prior to this pupils had been relentlessly practising events during both lessons and extracurricular clubs with the aim to begin the season on a high.

The U14 girls started off with a bang, securing three golds, two silvers and three bronzes across track and field! Oreo Oyedare's event hurdles kicked off the first event of the season. After having an electric ride in 2023 she reminded us of her talent and confidently finished 1st place, keeping up her winning streak from last year. Flora Watson also showed her power by wiping out the competition, again placing first place in shot. Finally to conclude the winners of the day newcomer Calleigh Collins took on the other seasoned middle distance runners, taking an early lead and gradually increasing it throughout confidently to finish more than 15m in front of her next competitor! Erin Kang also put in a top performance in long jump, placing a very strong 2nd, similar to Amy MacDonald in javelin and the relay team who showcased their seamless changeovers placing a close 2nd. To finish off Rosie Cameron impressed us with her debut attempt of 300m sprint placing 3rd, alongside Maya Gizynska also placing 3rd in the 1500m. Overall combining their results from both track and field they placed 2nd!

The U16 girls also worked very hard securing both golds and bronzes. Paige Wadley continued her winning streak in the 800m race leading by a long stretch, starting the season off strong. Summer Appleby also smashed her race, winning the 300m sprint with an outstanding run, showing determination right until the finish line. Honor Beverstock placed 3rd in the second track event of the season: hurdles, showing her speed, similarly new comer Rosie Vangu also managed to achieve a bronze in her first shot put competition showing off her effortless glide technique. Oreo Oyedare continued the trend and also threw her way to 3rd position in discus, as did Paige Wadley again jumping her way to 3rd in triple jump and Lily Van in javelin! To finish the girls showed fantastic teamwork and smooth changeovers by finishing 3rd in the relay. As a combined effort the girls managed to place 3rd in the competition.

The U14 boys continued to showcase their practice and work hard and achieve even more bronzes for us at Stanborough. Firstly, Corey James in high jump placing 3rd, Sam Rellos running the 200m race and placing 3rd in an incredibly fast competition. Adawale Adekanye also jumped his way to 3rd place in the long jump competition showing flight in his technique, as did Lucas Gough in Shot Put again with some powerful throws placing 3rd. Overall combining their track and field results the boys placed 5th in the competition. The U16 boys also managed to compete confidently and make the podium. Firstly Chika Chukwu showed speed and power placing 3rd in Long Jump, Henry Ottoway placing 3rd in javelin, and finally Luka Puica also showing his strength in shot put, again placing 3rd. Overall the boys placed 5th in this week's county league competition with their combined efforts. In reflection, were very impressed in the boys who filled in the events of those who could not make it due to unavoidable absences. This is exactly the attitude we want and hope for from our students and look forward to our next match where we have a full team.

To conclude, all athletes who competed in the first county league fixture of the season worked incredibly hard and made us so proud to have them representing us! Training will continue on Tuesdays after school as we get

ready for our next county league fixture which will take place next

week in St Albans. Bring it on!
