They had a great insight into the ice levels depleting rapidly in Antarctica; viewing galaxies through telescopes; spectroscopy of a star and how neutrinos are detected and brain scanners to detect warning of degrading brain activity.




#### Stanborough School Promotes Science in our local Primary Schools

Start them young and feed their curious minds!

The Stanborough science team have been working with local primary schools over the past month, students from seven different primary schools have come to Stanborough to enjoy the secondary expertise and equipment provided by the science team. They extracted DNA, made indicators to identify acids and alkalis and calculated speed using data loggers. The students were excellently behaved, and the primary schools departed, even more enthusiastic about science than they had started.

Further outreach work has been carrying on at The Ryde School and Templewood school, where Stanborough have been lending their subject knowledge and time to support the primary schools with some tricky parts of the Key Stage 2 curriculum. In The Ryde, the subject of mechanics: levers, pulleys and gears was investigated and as well as being able to work with some very intricate equipment, the



At Templewood, students were eager to learn about separations, and learned about chromatography, crystallisation, distillation and filtering. We even managed to solve a murder along the way. Again, the class were in great learning routines and were a credit to their school.

A special thank you must go to Gemini Shah, who works tirelessly to put all these sometimes rather unusual requests together! Without the science technician team, none of this would be possible!

### Yr7-8 Geography Summer Challenge

This summer we would like to challenge all pupils in years 7 and 8 to recognise and enjoy the Geography that is all around us! Attempt any of the challenges below to receive Class Charts points and prizes.

#### **CARTOON**

Draw a cartoon to explain any idea you have studied in Geography to a younger pupil. It must be accurate and use key vocabulary

#### **LOCAL AREA**

Walk around your local area and consider what has influenced the place (e.g. migration, history, money, weather, rivers...).

Present your thoughts as a poster or annotated photo.

#### **POSTCARD**

Write or create a postcard from a place you have visited over the summer (even if it is local!) and give it to your Geography teacher in September.

#### VIDEO MAKER

Make a short video on a geographical topic you find interesting. This can be using stop-motion, movie maker or by filming.

#### DOCUMENTARY

Watch any Geographical documentary and write a headline to summarise what the documentary was about. Write down what you found most interesting and any further questions you have.

#### **BOOK**

For any book you have read, how important is the place or location to the story? Would the story change if it was set somewhere else?

#### **FILM**

Watch any film and write down the geography of the film. Include location, people and cultures, weather, mood, events.

#### WILDCARD

Be creative! Explore or present a geographical topic of your choice in any way you like (model, podcast, collage).

#### IN THE NEWS

Follow the news for a week and keep a note of geographical news stories. Which themes come up most often? Which areas are not covered?

Keep a record of the challenges you complete and hand them in to your Geography teacher in the first week back next September.

- 1-3 Challenges = Bronze award
- 4-6 Challenges = Silver Award
- 7-9 Challenges = Gold Award

Any pupils who impress us with exceptional effort will be nominated for a Headteachers Award.




