
Open Evening, 26th September 2024

Road Safety and Parking

There are parking restrictions and other safety measures on Lemsford Lane which include double yellow lines. All students and parents should think seriously about safety when travelling to and from school.

The staff car park and visitors' car park must not be used by parents to drop off or pick up students at the beginning or end of the day and residents' driveways should not be used or blocked.

We encourage parents to drop off and pick up students from the Stanborough Lakes car park at the start and the end of the day as this will avoid congestion in the roads surrounding our school.

Students walking to school should be particularly careful crossing the road and use the proper safe crossing places shown by the raised areas of the road.



The staff car park is out of bounds to students, and they must not endanger themselves by cutting through to enter or leave the school. Students also must not walk through the front visitor's car park and must go straight through the door opposite the pedestrian gate they have entered through. We are fortunate that we have separate pedestrian entrances, which all students should use.

Students travelling by bus should ensure that they keep away from the road when queuing for the bus.

We hope that you will discuss these issues with your children and that they will think seriously about their own safety.

Thank you for supporting the school in ensuring that our high expectations are maintained both in school as well as on the way to and from school. It is important that students wear full uniform and behave in a responsible way on their way to and from school as they are representing the school and the school community.

Please remind your child to respect our neighbours while on their way to and from school, to keep our community clean and tidy and not to drop litter. Please encourage your child to be vigilant when crossing the road and to consider other road and pavement users.

Uniform Policy for Coats

As the weather is changing and students may feel the need to wear a coat we would like to remind you of our uniform policy for coats. This states that coats must be a plain black outdoor coat with no large logos or branding.

NEW! Reward Store 2024

We are excited to launch the Class Charts Reward Store! Students can use their points to buy items, passes and access to trips throughout the school year.



How does it work?

Students will be able to see their spendable points in the reward store. Their spendable points are worked out by taking their negative points off their positive points. So, if a student has 500 positive points and 100 negative points they will have 400 spendable points.

Students can log onto the reward store at any point to put in an order. This will be given to them by their tutor or by a member of the admin team.

Some of the bigger items include a trip to Thorpe Park. Students will need to save their points up during the year to go on this trip. The big items (Thorpe Park and Gosling trampoline park) are still paid trips. The points enable students to take a day off school and be part of the trip. Students will still need to pay for the trip.

Other items include stationary, vouchers, 'skip the queue' passes etc.


We hope this incentivises students to gain reward points and teaches them some valuable lessons on budgeting!




MFL Comic Strip



NEW MHFA Training Dates- Parents/Carers

The Emotional Mental Wellbeing in Education Team are offering funded training programmes to support parents/carers to improve the mental health and wellbeing of pupils aged 8-18.

All MHFA Training is facilitated by an approved MHFA Trainer.

MHFA Champion Course - provides an understanding of common mental health issues and how they affect young people. The ability to spot signs of mental ill health in young people and guide them to a place of support along with knowledge and confidence and skills to support positive wellbeing.

MHFA First Aider Course - this course works on the basis that there is a role in our communities for mental health first aiders – people that feel confident to go to someone experiencing emotional distress, provide initial help and guide them towards more specialist support.
