We will have both Oaklands College and Services for Young People present, who will be able to talk to our students and their parents about the application process for pathways other than Stanborough 6th form.



Eco-Schools Update

Dr S. Jolly, Eco-Schools Co-ordinator writes:

The Kaleidoscope Garden created by the Nature & Eco Club last year is still looking good with nasturtiums, poppies, verbena, rudbeckia and field scabious still in flower. As well as bringing some colour to the Year 8 & 9 quad area, we have spotted several species of insect including bees and ladybirds. This year was a bad year for butterflies across the UK, but as we continue to develop the area, providing shelter as well as nectar and food plants for the caterpillars, we hope to spot them visiting the new garden. The sunflowers looked lovely over the summer for a week or so but the cheeky squirrels chewed off the flower heads so we will have to devise some sort of shield next year! We have collected seeds from many of the plants so we can grow new plants next year and most of us have sampled the tasty nasturtium leaves.

We are planning to grow more food crops and involve more students in sowing seeds and nurturing the plants. We have already planted some onion sets in the Art Quad which should be ready to harvest in the spring. A second raised bed has been made by Jimmy in Year 9, so we hope to grow some different bean varieties and other vegetables next year. We have received some great advice from Miss Roberts who has joined us this term. Any help, old tools, spare seeds or plant donations are always welcome – do get in touch if you have anything to offer!

To kick off our work towards this year's Eco-Schools Green Flag Award, some of the Eco Ambassadors have completed the annual Environmental Review for the school. We will continue to meet after half term each Week B Wednesday at Tutor Time in room S1.





In November, we are expecting a delivery of 400 tiny saplings from the Woodland Trust, on behalf of WGC Rotary Club. Our Eco Ambassadors are looking forward to taking part in this wonderful community project and will be planting the young trees on Stanborough Road, just the other side of the school boundary. Look out for our report next month and for further updates on this year's projects.


