








The consortium is made up of the five secondary schools in Welwyn and Hatfield




Advantages of Consortium Working

The curriculum is based on student needs

Good practice and expertise is shared across all schools

Students may experience part of their education within a different learning environment

A broader range of subjects / subject combinations







Consortium entry requirements

- Standard entry requirement for the Welwyn Hatfield Consortium is five Grade 9-4 GCSEs including English at Grade 4 or above.
- Different pathways have a mandatory GCSE Average Points Score (APS)
- Some subjects will have additional entry requirements



Entry requirements

The APS requirement means that every subject counts!

Offers are made based on teacher predictions.

Your mock exams will give me the first indication of your potential – they are important!



6th Form Entrance Criteria

Students who do not achieve 9-4 in English and/or Maths will be required to attend retake lessons and resit the exam(s). Students who wish to take more than 3 A levels must have approval from their Head of 6th Form before submitting an application.

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
Pastoral Support


- Students are a full member of their home site no matter how many teaching sites they attend
- Throughout their time in the sixth form, they will be assigned a mentor or a tutor
- The Head of Sixth and their team will be responsible for monitoring students' academic guidance alongside their pastoral care

Home site and course choices

- We would expect students to remain at their current home site, unless there are extenuating circumstances for a move
- A move requires the student to apply to their desired new home site and to go through their application process fully
- References are collected for all change of home site
- All students must study their subjects at their home site if they are able to, exceptions being a clash of subjects or subjects only delivered at a different teaching site


